## SAINT THOMAS MORE

Husband and father  
(1478-1535)

Patron of Attorneys and Politicians

Feast Day – June 22

Thomas was born in London in 1478. He became a lawyer and a member of the British parliament. Because he was so well educated, he was a tutor for King Henry VIII when he was young. In 1529, the king appointed Thomas the Lord Chancellor of England. Thomas was a husband and father. He is recognized for his fidelity to Church teachings, especially regarding marriage. He spoke with honesty and integrity, and made the ultimate sacrifice. King Henry wanted to divorce his wife and marry another woman, but the pope would not give his approval. King Henry expected Thomas to take his side, but Thomas refused, and resigned his position in 1532. King Henry decided to separate the Church of England from the Catholic Church in Rome. He ordered parliament to write a document naming him the head of the Church of England. This document was called the Oath of Supremacy. King Henry demanded that all the bishops in England and his entire government sign the oath. Thomas refused because he knew that the pope was the successor of Saint Peter and that there could be only one pope and one Church. King Henry was furious for the lack of support from his chancellor. Thomas was arrested and imprisoned in the Tower of London for fifteen months. He was declared guilty of treason and was sentenced to death. He was executed on July 6, 1535, and was canonized in 1935, along with his friend, Saint John Fisher. We honor Saint Thomas More as a person of courage. He lived the moral virtue of fortitude. He courageously defended his Catholic faith. "I die the King's good servant and God's first".

## Gaining a Plenary Indulgence

The plenary indulgence is a gift of Jesus Christ to his Church, out of his love and mercy. The pope, with the authority given to him, can decide when to distribute this gift. "Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven" (Mt 18:18). During the year of Saint Joseph (March 2021 – March 2022) there are multiple options to receive it. The plenary indulgence can heal any deficiencies in the soul of a person who is dead, and make it whole in order to experience the eternal joy of heaven in God's presence. The plenary indulgence can also be offered for oneself.

### Requirements:

- Have sacramentally confessed your sins;
- Receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the indulgence, only Holy Communion is required);
- Pray for the intentions of the pope (at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary);
- Detachment from sin.
