Brother of St. James the Less and “cousin” to Jesus, St. Jude is the patron saint of hopeless causes. Jude was known as a healer and thought to have the gift of exorcism. He has been traditionally considered the author of the Epistle of St. Jude, and thought to have preached the Gospel in Mesopotamia, Syria and Persia, where he and St. Simon were martyred.
